Tosics Iván (1952) a Városkutatás Kft egyik ügyvezető igazgatója. Matematikus és szociológus (PhD) végzettségű, hosszú gyakorlattal városfejlődési, városszociológiai, stratégiai fejlesztési, lakáspolitikai és EU regionális politikai témakörökben. Széles körben, leginkább angol nyelven jelentek meg publikációi. 2011-től az URBACT programban a négy Tematikus pólus menedzserének (Thematic Pole Manager) egyikeként vett részt, 2016 januárjától URBACT Program Szakértőként folytatja munkáját. A Pécsi Tudományegyetem Politológia Tanszék Doktori Iskolájában tanít. Elnökhelyettese az European Network of Housing Research (ENHR) szervezetnek, míg az European Urban Research Association (EURA) szervezetben végrehajtó bizottsági tag. 2013-ig tagja volt a UN-HABITAT HS-NET Advisory Board-nak. Policy Editor funkciót tölt be az Urban Research and Practice folyóiratban, tagja a 'Journal of Housing and the Built Environment' és a 'Housing Studies' folyóiratok szerkesztő bizottságának. Budapestet képviselte szakmai oldalról 1996 és 2010 között az EURO CITIES városszövetség munkájában, az Economic Development Forumban majd az Executive Committee-ben. Részt vett Budapest Városrehabilitációs Konceptiójának kialakításában és vezette azt a konzorciumot, amely kidolgozta Budapest Városfejlesztési Konceptióját.
